
TO: BALL PARK BEER LICENSEES
SUBJECT: DELIMITATION OF LICENSED PREMISES

The Authority has ruled that, except as hereafter provided, where a license is issued pursuant to Section 55-a of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law, the entire baseball park, race track or other athletic field or stadium shall be considered as the licensed premises, and that by reason thereof the licensee may sell beer for on-premises consumption in any part of the said baseball park, race track or other athletic field or stadium. The responsibility of the licensee for any and all violations that may be committed upon such licensed premises shall also extend to all parts of the said baseball park, race track or other athletic field or stadium.

Where a licensee desires to limit the sale of beer to certain portions of the baseball park, race track or other athletic field or stadium, such licensee may file at the appropriate Zone Office of the Authority on or before May 15, 1948 an affidavit, in duplicate, designating specifically those portions of the baseball park, race track or other athletic field or stadium which are to be excluded from coverage by the license. Such affidavit must be accompanied by a plan, drawing or detailed description of that portion of the premises which is to be exempted from coverage by the license.

The privilege of delimiting the licensed premises shall also be extended to future applicants for ball park beer licenses provided that the affidavit called for above is incorporated as part of the application for such license.
