TO: ALL RAILROAD CAR LICENSEES

SUBJECT: RAILROAD CARS


At the meeting held on November 12, 1952, the Board authorized the issuance of Railroad Car Liquor, Wine and/or Beer License under a new option (Option C) in addition to Options A and B already prevailing.

Option "C": A Railroad Company may procure a license for any of its unscheduled trains operating in New York State. Such license may be utilized to cover any unscheduled train of the railroad company without further consent of the Authority but may be so used by only one train at any particular time. The license must be displayed in a conspicuous place in the railroad car in which alcoholic beverages are to be sold and at all other times it must be maintained in the office of the general superintendent of the railroad company at its principal terminal in New York State. The license must be displayed in a conspicuous place in the railroad car at all times whenever alcoholic beverages are being sold therein.

The Board further provided that a bond issued by a qualified surety company in the sum of \$500. be filed with the State Liquor Authority in support of every Railroad Car license applied for under Option C.

Rule 9, promulgated pursuant to Section 112 of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law has been amended to indicate the above mentioned bond requirement for Railroad Car licenses under Option "C".
