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**Disciplinary Action Taken by The State Liquor Authority  
Full Board Meeting**

The Members of the New York State Liquor Authority (SLA) held a regular Full Board meeting on Wednesday, July 12, 2006. Disciplinary actions taken by the Members of the Board, Chairman Daniel B. Boyle, Commissioner Lawrence J. Gedda and Commissioner Noreen Healey, include the revocation of 2 alcoholic beverage licenses, cancellation of 15, and the suspension of 1 license for a period of 5 days.

“Licensees who do not take the responsibility of having a license seriously will lose the privilege,” said Chairman Boyle. “The State Liquor Authority will continue its ongoing efforts to ensure the safety of the public.”

Under the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law, a Revocation terminates a business’s license and bans the licensee from holding any alcoholic beverage license for a period of two years. A Cancellation also terminates the license, but does not ban the licensee from applying for a license for two years. A Suspension prohibits the consumption or sale of alcoholic beverages for a designated period.

In addition, Board Members voted to fine 157 licensees \$318,450 and claimed 10 bonds for \$8,775. “By imposing these penalties, we are sending a clear message to the industry that violations of the ABC Law will not be tolerated,” said Chairman Boyle. A Civil penalty is a monetary fine levied against the licensee. A Bond Claim is a claim made against the licensee’s surety bond, which is a requirement for holding a liquor license.

The chart below shows all Revocations, Cancellations and Suspensions imposed by the Board at the July 12, 2006 meeting. 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To ensure prompt investigations, compliance with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law and for the convenience of licensees and community members, the SLA is separated into three geographical zones. Zone 1 includes New York City, Long Island and Westchester County. Zone 2 includes the Capital Region, the Mohawk Valley, the North Country, Central New York, the Finger Lakes and part of the Southern Tier. Zone 3 includes part of the Southern Tier and all of Western New York. Before going to the Full Board, disciplinary matters have been investigated by the SLA Enforcement Unit or been referred to the Authority's Office of Counsel by local law enforcement or another government agency. Each case is examined on its individual merits before the Members of the Authority make their final determination.

The State Liquor Authority regulates and controls the manufacture, sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages within the State. The Authority works with local law enforcement agencies and localities across the State to ensure compliance with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law. In addition, the Authority issues and renews licenses and permits to manufacturers, distributors, wholesalers and retailers of alcoholic beverages.

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
